# LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT IN HEALTH ACT 2007

The Lichfield District Council (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2023

# Made 11 January 2023

Coming into force in accordance with article 1(2)

Lichfield District Council ("the Council"), in accordance with section 82 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 ("the 2007 Act"), has undertaken a community governance review and made recommendations dated 20<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

The Council has decided to give effect to those recommendation and, in accordance with section 93 of the 2007 Act, has consulted with the local government electors and other interested persons and has had regard to the need to secure that community governance reflects the identities and interests of the community and is effective and convenient.

The Council in accordance with section 100 of the 2007 Act, has had regard to guidance issued under that section.

The Council makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 86, 98 and 240(10) of the 2007 Act

#### Citation and commencement

- 1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Lichfield District Council (Reorganisation of Community Governance) Order 2023
  - (2) Subject to paragraphs 3 and 4 below, this Order shall come into force on 1st April 2023
  - (3) for the purposes of local elections this Order shall come into force on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2023.
  - (4) for the purposes of schedule 1:-
  - (i) the calculation of, and provision of a budget for newly created parishes
  - (ii) proceedings preliminary or relating to the elections of parish councillors for any parish within the district, to be held on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2023 this Order shall come into force on the day after that on which it is made.

## Interpretation

## 2 In this Order –

"district" means the district of Lichfield District Council

"existing" means existing on the date this Order is made

"map" means a map set out in Schedule 2 to this order

"new parish" means the new parish of Streethay and the new parish of Fradley constituted by Schedule 1

"ordinary day of election of councillors" has the meaning given by section 37 of the Representation of the People Act 1983

"registration officer" means an officer appointed for the purpose of, and in accordance with, section 8 of the Representation of the People Act 1983 (as amended)

"incidental matters" means the incidental, consequential, transitional and supplementary provision of general application for the purposes of, and in consequence of, reorganisation orders, made by the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) (England) Regulations 2008

# Agreements about incidental matters

3. This Order has effect subject to any agreement made under section 99 (agreements about incidental matters) of the 2007 Act relevant to any provision of this Order

#### **Effect of this Order**

- 4. Changes have been made to community governance in respect of those parishes and or their parish group and or parish council specified in Schedule 1 to this Order in the manner described therein.
- 5. Maps of newly constituted parishes are produced in Schedule 2 to this Order.

## **Electoral Register**

6. The registration officer for the district shall make such rearrangement of, or adaptation of, the register of local government electors as may be necessary for the purposes of, and in consequence of, this order.

### Transitional provision

7. Until the councillors elected to the council of the new parishes of Streethay and Fradley at the elections to be held on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2023 come into office, the new parishes shall be represented by those persons who immediately before 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 are the elected councillors for the Lichfield District Council for the wards which are within the boundary of the new parish council.

# Order date

8. 1<sup>st</sup> April 2023 is the order date for the purposes of the Local Government (Parishes and Parish Councils) (England) Regulations 2008

#### **SCHEDULE 1**

Changes have been made to the community governance arrangements in respect of the following parish councils

#### FRADLEY AND STREETHAY COUNCIL

- 1. The Parish Council of Fradley and Streethay shall be dissolved.
- 2. There shall be two new parish councils known as Fradley Parish Council and Streethay Parish Council which shall be comprised from the properties located within the Parish Council of Fradley and Streethay (as dissolved by para 1 above).
- 3. The division of the General Reserves of the Parish Council of Fradley and Streethay shall be apportioned between the two new Parishes as follows:- 61.67% to the new parish of Fradley; 38.33% to the new parish of Streethay.
- 4. The number of parish councillors to be elected to the new parish of Fradley shall be ten.
- 5. The number of parish councillors to be elected to the new parish of Streethay shall be seven
- 6. For the purposes of regulation 3 of the Local Government Finance (New Parishes) England Regulations 2008 there is specified in relation to the Parish of Fradley the sum of £115,214.42
- 7. For the purposes of regulation 3 of the Local Government Finance (New Parishes) England Regulations 2008 there is specified in relation to the Parish of Streethay the sum of £70,806.49
- 8. Each ward shall comprise the area designated on the map with the legend description 'Fradley and Streethay proposed split' annexed in Schedule 2 to this order with the new split of the parishes demarcated by a broken red line
- 9. The election of all parish councillors for the new parish of Fradley and the new parish of Streethay shall be held on the ordinary day of election of councillors in 2023
- 10. The annual meeting of the new Fradley Parish and the new Streethay Parish shall take place no later than 14 days after the day on which the councillors elected to the new parish councils take office.

# LICHFIELD CITY

### Garrick Road Ward and Chadsmead Ward

- 1. The existing Garrick Road Ward (coloured lilac on the Lichfield City Wards 2015 plan annexed in Schedule 2) shall be amalgamated into Chadsmead Ward (coloured cream on the aforementioned plan)
- 2. As a result of (1) the existing Garrick Road Ward shall cease to exist.
- 3. The number of councillors to be elected for the Chadsmead Ward shall be four.
- 4. The Chadsmead Ward shall comprise the area designated on the map labelled Lichfield City Wards and provided in Schedule 2 to this Order and demarcated by a solid black line.

# **SCHEDULE 2**

# Maps delineating Parish/Ward Lines

- i) Lichfield City Wards 2015
- ii) Fradley and Streethay proposed split
- iii) Lichfield City Wards Ward boundaries/Previous Ward boundaries

#### **Burton Old Road and Stowe Ward**

- 1. The existing Burton Old Road Ward (coloured turquoise on the Lichfield City Wards 2015 plan annexed in Schedule 2) shall be amalgamated into Stowe Ward (coloured blue on the aforementioned plan).
- 2. As a result of (1) the existing Burton Old Road Ward shall cease to exist
- 3. The number of councillors to be elected for the Stowe Ward shall be five.
- 4. The Stowe Ward shall comprise the area designated on the map labelled Lichfield City Wards and provided in Schedule 2 to this Order and demarcated by a solid black line.

# Pentire Road Ward and Boley Park Ward

- 1. The existing Pentire Road Ward (coloured dark green on the Lichfield City Wards 2015 plan) shall be amalgamated into Boley Park Ward (coloured yellow on the aforementioned plan).
- 2. As a result of (1) the existing Pentire Road Ward shall cease to exist
- 3. The number of councillors to be elected for the Boley Park Ward shall be four.
- 4. The Boley Park Ward shall comprise the area designated on the map labelled Lichfield City Wards and provided in Schedule 2 to this Order and demarcated by a solid black line.

## **Curborough Ward**

1. The number of Councillors to be elected to the Curborough Ward shall be increased from three to four.

## **Leomansley Ward**

1. The number of Councillors to be elected to the Leomansley Ward shall be increased from five to six.

#### LONGDON PARISH COUNCIL

The number of Councillors to be elected to the Longdon Parish Council shall be decreased from eleven to nine of whom two shall be elected for the parish ward of Gentleshaw and seven for the parish ward of Longdon.
