Supporting guide to Local Government Reorganisation



About



- This document is from Lichfield District Council and aims to support you in understanding and sharing your views on Local Government Reorganisation.
- The UK government is looking at changing the way local services are provided.
- The UK government has asked local councils to come up with an idea of how to do this in Staffordshire.
- This document explains the UK government's idea and how we think it can work in Southern and Mid Staffordshire.

What is Local Government Reorganisation (LGR)?



- At the moment, Staffordshire has:
 - **1 county council**, which provides and manages services that are linked across the County, like schools, social services and roads.
 - 8 district & borough councils, which provide and manage more local services, like helping people with housing, waste collection, planning and more.
- The UK government's idea is to replace the 9 councils in Staffordshire with a smaller number of **unitary councils**.
- Unitary councils are bigger councils that provide and manage all services in an area.
- This idea is called Local Government Reorganisation

What have we been asked to do?




- The UK government has asked all councils in Staffordshire to work on potential proposals for Local Government Reorganisation.
- Lichfield District Council is working with **five other local councils** across **Southern and Mid Staffordshire** to look at changing how local services are provided.
- The guidance provided to us is to look at establishing a single tier of local government with a population of up to or around 500,000.

What do we think?




- Staffordshire could be split into a total of **2 or 3 unitary councils**, with one being in the North, and then Southern and Mid Staffordshire have 1 or 2 unitary councils.
- Each council will **provide** all services for the area they are in charge of.
- This is instead of the services being split between county and district councils.



What do we think?



- Here at Lichfield District Council, we are voting in favour of having three unitary councils across Staffordshire. We believe this will ensure:
 - Closer alignment with community identity and geography for residents
 - Local Government remains local, and continues to be visible, accessible and knowledgeable about their patch.
 - Better access to and responsiveness from public services, with residents being closer to decision makers and better tailored to the needs of local people.
 - This structure allows for stronger, more **locally accountable governance** while still achieving the efficiencies of reorganisation.



What does this mean for you?



The idea of LGR means it should:

- Make services simpler and easier to access
- Help you know who to contact
- Join up services like housing, health, transport and care
- Save money and run more efficiently

If a new council is created, this could affect:

- How and when your bins are collected
- Who looks after your roads and schools
- How you get support with housing, care, and community services
- How local decisions are made in your area
